Don't Stop Now

What would happen if you stopped eating? Foolish question because that'll never happen, right? But stay with me. What would happen if you did? What would happen if you quit drinking water, or what would happen if you stopped breathing? Of course! If you did any of these things you'd die. Our bodies simply cannot survive without food, water or oxygen. It may take longer if we quit eating than if we quit breathing, but eventually the end result would be the same.

You may not have thought about it, but that same principle applies to your spiritual life. Our souls need nourishing even more than our physical bodies do. In the letter to the Hebrews, the writer was lamenting that many of the people to whom he was writing were spiritually malnourished. Read Hebrews 5.11-14. Some of those people had been Christians for as many as thirty years, and yet, they were still feeding on milk (of the word) when they should have matured to the point of feeding on solid food (of the word). Even worse, some who had "once been enlightened," and had "tasted the heavenly gift," and had "shared in the Holy Spirit," and had "tasted the goodness of the word of God and the powers of the age to come," had for some unexplained reason stopped feasting on God and had fallen away (Hebrews 6.4-6). They no longer had an appetite for God and His word. Consequently, they were either spiritually dying, or dead (Hebrews 6.7-8).

That's one reason Christians are encouraged by God over and over to keep growing in grace and knowledge. Don't stop now; keep on growing. Peter's final words in the New Testament (2 Peter 3.14-18) urge us to "be diligent," to "take care," and to "grow in grace and knowledge." Sure there will be some things difficult to understand. Sure there will be hardships. Sure Satan will do whatever he can to get us to stop feeding on God. Satan uses all these things to discourage and destroy us. But remember this. Satan can do nothing to make us stop without our consent. We have a power within us that Satan cannot defeat ... without our approval (Eph. 6.10ff).

That's why new Christians are instructed to "long for the pure spiritual milk, that you may grow up into salvation" (1 Peter 2.2). That's why the Thessalonians were taught to "increase and abound in love for one another, and for all" and to "do this more and more" (1 Thess. 3.12, 4.9-10). That's why God gave the church spiritual leaders who could help them grow up into the fullness of Christ (Ephesians 4.11-16).

So, don't stop praying; don't stop studying and worshiping; don't stop serving / working for the Lord. Stopping is deadly. Keep it up no matter what! Even when you retire, don't stop!!
