### Understanding How the Church Grows—Evangelism

One of the major flaws of the denominational approach to church growth is the exaltation of culture and individual desire above all else; including many times God and His Word. Unfortunately, our own brethren have not been without guilt in this matter and some have sought to emulate the megachurch. The mega-church method for church growth offers non-demanding, easy listening, offence free sermons. If it is controversial or unpopular, then don't talk about it, regardless of what God say's about the subject.

After all you don't want to offend anyone or make them uncomfortable by suggesting that there are any actual biblical commands to be obeyed in their lives. In other words, if you want to grow then don't preach or teach about anything that people do not like because if they don't like the message they won't keep coming and you won't grow. Sensually appealing worship services are designed to give the "worshipper" everything they want and nothing they don't (praise teams, instruments, dramatic performances, dance teams, etc.)

The result—what you will often see as a result of this kind of approach to church growth is what is commonly referred to as swelling (not real growth just the transfer of a group of believers from one church to another). When you give people exactly what they want they many times will come to you in droves but this again is not real church growth as God designed it. The problem with church swelling is that after a while the thrill of this new church and its people friendly preaching and worship usually wears off. Then family by family they leave and return to whatever they had in the first place.

Sad fact: swelling is the only kind of growing that some churches ever do. They have a failure to understand that their focus is not to be limited to what is taking place within the walls of their own building. They have a failure to understand that God has given the church an outward focused mission. The local church is God's lifeline and lighthouse to a world that is lost in darkness. God intended for the message of the gospel to be communicated by the apostles to as many people as they could tell, who would then in turn tell all they could tell—2 Tim.2:2.

Who were these men that were to be entrusted with the sharing of the message to the next generation if not the members of the local church? The fact of the matter is that some churches never really grow because of the fact that they are too concerned with their own internal needs and wants that they never take time to look up and look out at the lost of this world. "Behold, I say to you, lift up your eyes and look to the fields, for they are already white for harvest" (Jn.4:36).

Brethren we live in a world that is in dire need of not only some good news but more importantly the Good News. We live in a world that has become entangled by the cumbersome weight of sin, which is a major cause of heartache and despair which comes from the fact that their sins separate them from God. What is the solution to this problem? It is the gospel of Jesus Christ. The gospel is the cure for all of the spiritual ailments that plague our society; but how is the world going to going to get the gospel unless we take it to them?
