# Lessons for Today

### Understanding How the Church Grows—Education

All men today need exactly that same thing that Solomon acquired long ago directly from God. A wise and discerning heart, that is the ability to know right from wrong according to God and then to make proper application of that knowledge. Unfortunately for us that kind of heart can't be received directly from God and only comes through a diligent, constant, and fervent study of His Word. I say it is unfortunate not because we have to work to know God's will, but rather because of the fact that it does involve diligent effort, there are not as many wise and discerning hearts as we need in this world and in the church.

One of the clearest signs of a truly healthy congregation (healthy congregations grow), is seen in the amount of Bible knowledge possessed by those who belong to said congregation. "My People are destroyed for lack of knowledge" (Hos.4:6). Do you delight in the knowledge of God's Word? "I will delight myself in Your statutes, I will not forget Your word" (Ps.119:16). "Your testimonies are also my delight and my counselors" (Ps.119:24). "Make me walk in the path of your commandments, for I delight in it" (Ps.119:35).

Given the delight which should accompany the knowledge of God's word, every congregation of the Lord's church ought to be filled with members who know what the Bible teaches. And not only does every congregation need to be filled with members who know God's Word, they need to be filled with members who will "turn neither to the right or to the left" (Prov.4:27) of that Word. With this in mind I want today to discuss with the educational program of this congregation.

Strong educational programs are another defining characteristic of a healthy church and healthy churches are growing churches. Ira North used to say that "as goes the Bible program, so goes the church." In other words his belief was that a key element found in strong, vibrant, and growing churches was a strong emphasis on the quality of biblical knowledge that was be attained through the educational program of the church. The educational program of the church is a wonderful opportunity for every member of that church to grow in their knowledge of God's Word and thus in their relationship with God.

For years the denominations have emphasized the Bible school to the detriment of congregational worship while we in the churches of Christ have historically done the exact opposite. We have emphasized the congregational worship service to the detriment of the Bible school program. Neither is wise or effective in building strong, healthy, growing congregations. So how does the educational program help the church grow?

It provides an opportunity for the members of the church to grow in their knowledge of God's Word—the byproduct of that is increased faithfulness of the members—Individual Spiritual Growth. It also provides an opportunity for us to invite and reach out to our friends and neighbors—Congregational Growth. That covers the two areas of church growth that we are interested in and both can be accomplished through a strong emphasis on the Bible program.

Thus, it is my belief that in order for a church to grow it needs to place a strong emphasis on its educational program. No church filled with biblically illiterate people will ever grow as God intended. God's people are destroyed when a lack of knowledge is prevalent, both spiritually and numerically. If we want to grow we must make sure that our educational program becomes a high priority of this congregation. How can we share with others that which we do not possess?
